



68th Annual Invitational Main Trip

July 13th - 15th, 2018

We are excited to announce our 68th annual invitational Rubicon Trail excursion! As always we are planning another fun filled trip with great wheelin', wonderful food, amazing friends, and live music!

The plan this year will be to offer a couple of trip options. First will be a guided tour across the trail from Tahoe to the AJC property. We will be leaving from the staging area at the Tahoe trail head on Friday morning at 8AM. Try to be there a little early to check in with the guides. If you can't make the 8AM start you can always run the trail on your own, or with your own group, and try to meet up with us but you will not have any assistance from the club. The other option is to head into the AJC property from Loon Lake and then do some wheelin' on Saturday. Again you will be on your own getting to the property. Saturday morning we will be offering guided trail runs starting after breakfast or if you prefer you can simply hang out at the property all day and play in horseshoes, go fishing, swimming, or just enjoy everyone's company.

As for food, you are on your own for breakfast and lunch Friday but a spaghetti dinner will be served Friday night at the property. We will have a full breakfast for you Saturday morning, your own for lunch, but then a hearty steak dinner will be served Saturday night. After dinner the live music will begin! And don't forget the raffle Saturday night. Sunday morning we will have another big breakfast then it's time to head home.

Included in this package are several items that we encourage you to read very carefully. They are:

- Trip Itinerary
- Rules and General information
- Application for the Trip
- Insurance Release and Waiver (Everyone must sign)
- Film Night Flyer (Take lots of pictures!)
- Map of the trail

We are very specific as to what types of vehicles are allowed on the trip and the rules for participation. There will be **NO** exceptions. If you have any questions please feel free to contact: Sean Minor @ (530) 906-9632

The Club will be providing some meals in camp but you are on your own while out on the trail. Bring plenty to drink, snacks and lunch for when you are on the trail (Again, be prepared for cold conditions). Keep in mind that the trail as it is a county road and you are subject to all applicable laws. **LAW ENFORCEMENT WILL BE PRESENT!!** Please help us to make this a safe trip for everyone.



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General Information:

The Club property has certain amenities such as toilets, some lighting, and non-potable running water. The trail however, has no such luxuries. You should plan for it to be warm during the day and cold at night. Each participant must supply their own camping equipment, trail supplies, and appropriate clothing. We recommend, at a minimum, the following items:

- Sleeping Bag
- Tent
- Portable Toilet and toilet paper
- Warm Coat
- Tarp
- Extra Shoes
- Lip Balm
- Insect Repellent
- Ice Chest
- Trash Bags
- Wide Brim Hat
- Snacks
- Flashlight
- A LOT of Drinking Water
- Swim Suit
- Change of clothes for each day
- Sun Screen
- Blanket

This is by no means an exhaustive list. Bring what you feel you need to make your trip comfortable. Being out on the granite all day can be hot and cause dehydration or worse. BE PREPARED!!

Your vehicle should be prepared as well. There are certain items that the Club requires you to bring and some we recommend.

Required:

- Fire Extinguisher
- Roll Cage
- Seat Belts
- Working Emergency/Parking Brake
- Working Lights
- Current Registration and Proof of Insurance
- Tow Strap
- Trash Bags

Recommended:

- Ice Chest
- Hi-Lift Jack
- First Aid Kit
- Spare Parts (U-Joints, axle shafts, etc.)
- Spare Tire
- Winch
- Extra Gas
- Tools

If you choose to be in the guided tour group and you have mechanical difficulties, the Club will make every effort to help you get back on the trail. If your vehicle can not be repaired we will help to get you to the nearest safe location where you can make arrangements for repair and transport. As we said we will be going over the trail from Tahoe to the AJC property. We will have experienced Jeeps to help you along the way. Here are the route details and itinerary:

- Option A - Departure on Friday 13th will be at 8:00AM at the staging area at the Tahoe trail head. From Hwy 89 take McKinney Rubicon Springs Rd. You will go a short distance then left on Bellevue. After another short distance go right at the stop sign on to McKinney Rd. Stay straight for a bit then go left back onto McKinney Rubicon Springs Rd. You will see a trail access sign at that point. From there it's about 1.4 miles to the Staging Area. Make sure to take time to get gas and final supplies you may need in Tahoe City. A final check will be done at the trail head before making our way to the AJC property. No food will be provided until dinner at our property so please plan accordingly. For those choosing to depart at your own time, either on your own or with your own group, you will be on your own with no club support unless you are able to join up with us along the way. Dinner will be made available to you when you arrive at our property.



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- Option B – Go into the AJC property on Friday through the Loon Lake or Wentworth ends of the trail. You will be on your own with no club support until you arrive at our property. Saturday we will provide a full breakfast then offer guided tours on the trail. No lunch will be provided but we will serve a steak dinner that night and have a big raffle.

For everyone your packet of goodies, including T-shirts, will be available to you once you arrive at the AJC property.

Rules:

Rules will be strictly enforced as the presence of law enforcement and special interest groups is expected.

Participation is limited to registered 4WD vehicles which are legal for use on the trail such as (but not limited to):

- Jeep Universal or Wrangler
- Scout
- Bronco
- Land Rover
- Toyota Land Cruiser
- Nissan Patrol
- Suzuki

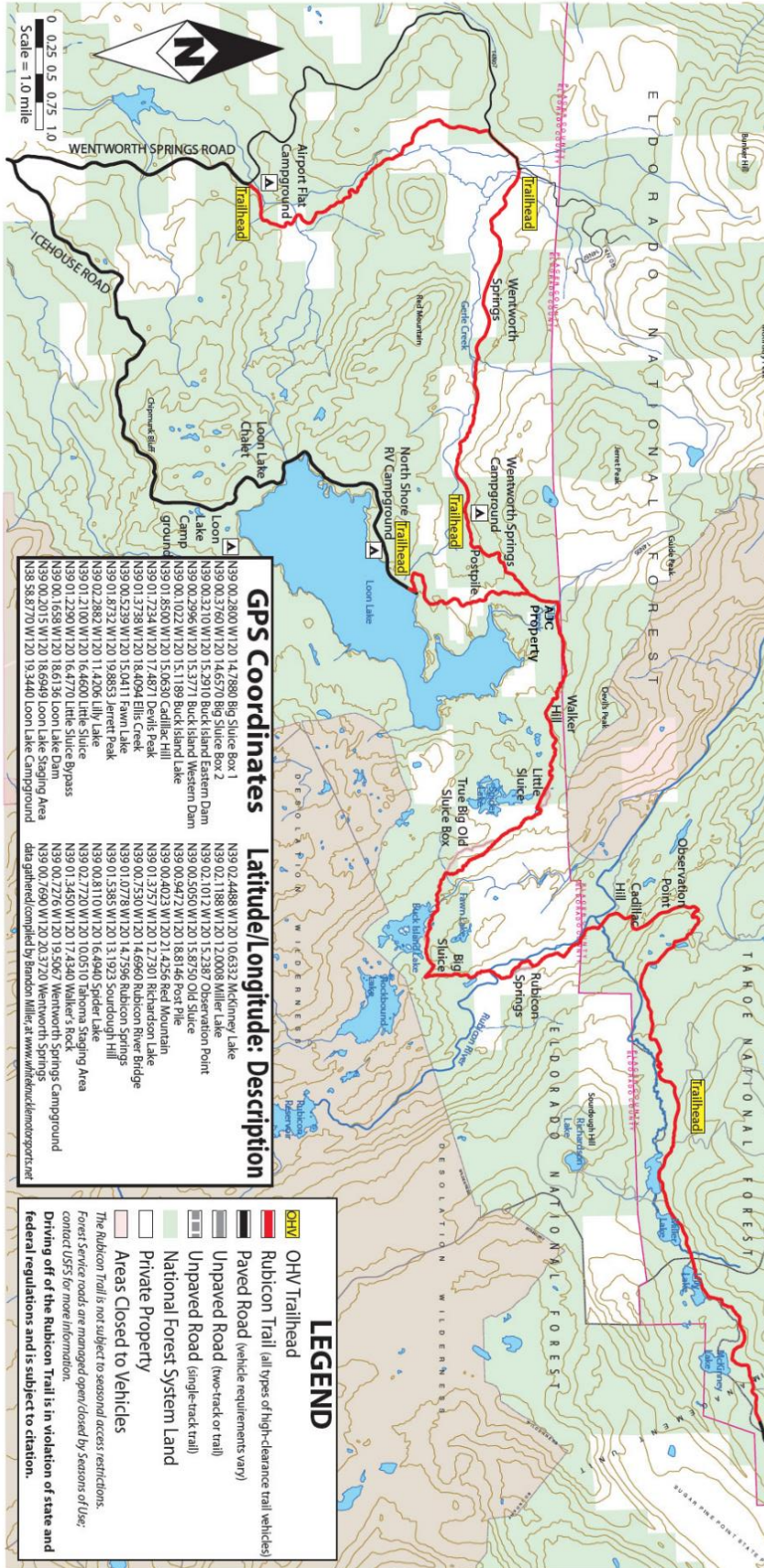
Participants must meet the following requirements:

- A minimum 35-inch tire with sufficient lift will be required!
- All drivers must possess a valid driver's license.
- All vehicles must be in good mechanical condition
- NO trailers
- All vehicles must carry California's required minimum insurance coverage
- All vehicles must have valid registration and be legal for use on the trail
- All participants under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian
- **NO one under the age of 16 is allowed to participate or be on the AJC property during the event ***
- NO firearms of any kind are allowed.
- NO dogs are allowed on the trip
- All posted camp rules will be strictly enforced
- **No participants will be allowed to leave the AJC property after dark unless incase of an emergency. If you leave the property you will not be allowed back in. ****

*** Enforcement of the 16-year-old minimum age limit will be strict. You will not be allowed to participate or stay at the AJC property if anyone in your party is underage. There will be no refunds. Proof of age will be required if there is ANY question. The atmosphere at the property tends to be adult oriented and not appropriate for younger children.**

**** No night wheeling will be allowed due to its inherent danger. If you insist on leaving the property after dark you will be on your own and not allowed back into the camp area. Wheeling after dark is only permitted if your AJC guided group has not reached camp by night fall due to trail conditions or circumstances beyond our control.**

The Auburn Jeep Club reserves the right to deny participation to anyone. All registrants agree to indemnify and hold harmless the Auburn Jeep club, its officers, members, and/or agents from damage and or injury incident. You must sign the attached "Release and Waiver of Liability and indemnity"
